



British Equestrian Federation Terms of Reference for the Director of Equine Development

(To be read in conjunction with the Terms of Reference for the BEF Board and are supplementary to them)

Role

The Director for Equine Development is elected by the Council to take responsibility within the Federation for all matters relating to the development of equine policy and support within the Federation

Responsibility

The Director for Equine Development, working with the executives in this area, is responsible for:

- The development of policy and budgets
- Representing the interests of the Council, stakeholders and executive
- Accountability for delivering the agreed policy and targets
- Liaising with and promoting the policy to relevant Member Body directors

Objectives

The Director for Equine Development is to promote the development of policies throughout the Federation for developing:

- The profile of equestrianism, equestrian sports, where related directly to the horse and British breeding
- Equine performance and Long Term Equine Development (LTED)
- Coaching, facilities and participation opportunities for the horse
- The Lead Body to develop the breeding of the sport horse and pony
- A research-driven data exchange process to inform the industry
- The National Equine Database
- Stud standards
- An integrated equine welfare programme amongst BEF Member Bodies

Method

Whilst the Director is responsible for governance and policy matters, the executives will be responsible for supporting the process of developing strategy and preparing budgets and for implementing strategy, once it is agreed.
