<p><b>Veterinary mark (V) 10 (increments on scale of .25)</b>            For limbs, hooves and musculoskeletal frame. The vet's mark will be an average of the score they attribute today and the score they believe the horse would obtain if any veterinary advice is followed.            Vet score explanation: Below 4 Some serious compromising features, 4 - 6 Some moderately compromising features, 7 Less significant compromising feature/s, 8 Mainly good features, 9 Very good features, 10 Excellent features</p>	Comments:	
<p><b>Frame (F) and build for ENDURANCE 10</b>            Should have a good head/neck connection with clean throat latch. Balanced or uphill in skeletal structure. Powerful hindquarters, well-formed forearm and second thigh, sloping shoulders, horizontal back and proportional leg length. Neither base narrow nor base wide. Neither elbows nor stifles to hug the body. Should give the appearance of having a balanced, proportional "leg at each corner".</p>	Comments:	
<p><b>Correctness of paces Walk for ENDURANCE (CPW) 10</b>            Should show a gait which is active, has impulsion, purpose and is supple. Rhythmical flight of foot during stride and rhythmical footfall. Should show suppleness through the back and body, which is seen in a noticeable swinging stride, should be free in the shoulder and elbow and show an over track.</p>	Comments:	
<p><b>Correctness of paces Trot for ENDURANCE (CPT) 10</b>            Your horse should show a gait which is active, free, light, energy efficient and ground covering yet has impulsion and balance sufficient to be maintained over distance. There should be considerable lightness of footfall shown by engagement of the hindquarter giving a powerful forward thrust. Any efficient gait permissible (pace or jog), avoidance of inefficient high knee action.</p>	Comments:	
<p><b>Athleticism (A) Canter plus the quality of all three paces for ENDURANCE 20</b>            Canter: Your horse should show a 3-time gait which rises in front, is active, straight, light footed, rhythmical and has impulsion and purpose with real forward motion. Should show balance on the straight and in direction changes. The horse should be able to lengthen and shorten its stride without loss of rhythm or balance. The body should remain horizontal.            All paces: loose, free, supple and forward going</p>	Comments:	
<p><b>Attitude (Att) for ENDURANCE 10</b>            Sufficiently calm and sensible to demonstrate a low heart rate at vetting intervals, yet a desire to go forward and to want to perform without excessive encouragement.</p>	Comments:	
<p><b>PREMIUM = V + F + CPW + CPT + A + Att divided by 7</b></p>
